

Poster Guidelines

- Organize your poster into subdivisions : Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion and Conclusion
- Avoid acronyms and extensive mathematical notations as much as possible
- Keep your presentation visuals simple and try using bright colours to enhance the details
- The title and author's information should be clearly visible from at least 3 feet distance and content of the presentation at least 1-2 feet
- Each poster should be approximately 1x1 M long

Judging Criteria

- When the competition is being conducted, each participant should be ready in front of his/her poster to answer all questions from the judges and they may ask questions during the evaluation of the poster. You will be given about 5-10 minutes to present your poster including questions and answers
- Judges will evaluate the enthusiasm of the presenter towards their interest and knowledge in the area of their research
- Apart from the judges you can also be present and share your research with other interested attendees
- The winners will be announced at the closing ceremony of the conference, if the winner is not present at the time of announcement, the decision of the winner will be withdrawn
- The judge's decision will be final and no clarification will be given
